Today we Commemorate:

- Daniel the Prophet & Ananias, Azarias, & Misail, the Three Holy Youths
- Dionysius of Zakynthos

The holy hierarch, Saint Dionysius, who was born and reared on Zakynthos, was the son of pious and wealthy parents, Mocius and Paulina by name. In his youth he entered the ancient monastery of the Strophada Islands, which lie south of Zakynthos, and there he donned the monastic habit. Later, he was appointed Archbishop of Aegina, and adorned its throne for a considerable time. Thereafter he returned to his homeland. One incident in his life especially reveals to what virtue he attained. A man came to him in desperation, witnessing that he had committed a murder, and was being pursued by the slain man's family. He asked Saint Dionysius to give him refuge. The Saint agreed to this, upon learning that it was his own brother whom the man had slain, he said nothing, but concealing the agony of his grief, hid him. When the Saint's kinsmen arrived at the monastery, he told them that the Murderer had gone by such and such a way. When they had departed, he admonished the man concerning the gravity of his sin, instructed him in repentance, and sent him off in peace having forgiven him his brother's murder. According to local tradition, this man later returned and became a monk at this same monastery. Saint Dionysius reposed in peace in 1621, leaving behind his sacred and incorrupt relics as a treasure for his fellow citizens.

Parents, please stop by on your way into Liturgy to get your children in costume. Sunday school will be released at its normal time.




Bookstore Open for Holiday Shopping


Bookstore will restock supplies such as charcoal, incense, candles, prayer cards, prayer ropes and bracelets, as in the past.

YEAR END GIVING GUIDELINES | Deadline December 31st



With the nativity season approaching and 2023 drawing to a close, we would like to offer guidance on how St. Katherine Greek Orthodox Church will be handling 2023 contributions as well as 2024 contributions.

The church office will be closed from Friday, December 29, 2023, through Monday, January 1, 2024.

The IRS's basic rule is a gift must be "delivered" to the church by December 31 for the gift to count as a contribution for that calendar year. The date of delivery depends on how the gift was made and delivered.

- In Person Physically received in the church office by December 30th during normal office hours. (Please keep in mind that the normal office hours are Tuesday-Thursday, 9:30am –3:30pm)
- US Postal Service Postmarked by December 31st.
- Private Delivery Service such as FedEx or UPS Physically received in the church office by December 30th during normal office hours. (Please keep in mind that the normal office hours are Tuesday-Thursday, 9:30am-3:30pm)

Online Giving through the St Katherine web site needs to be completed before December 31st. If using a credit card, it must be "fully processed" i.e. approved by the credit card issuer by December 31st.

<u>Payment made by check</u> should be dated "December 31, 2023" and the memo line should indicate which contribution year ("2023" or "2024") the payment is for.

<u>Donation of stock(s)</u> allow a member to support the church without affecting personal cash flow. Generally speaking, the most tax-advantaged approach is to donate stock held for more than one year that has appreciated in value. This provides for a larger charitable contribution and avoids tax on the capital gain. For stocks with a loss, it is advisable to sell it first and then donate the cash. If you are considering either option, please consult with your tax or financial advisor. Please contact Glenn Thorpe for our account information if you wish to donate stock.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from an IRA

Many older parishioners hold tax-deferred Individual Retirement Accounts or IRA's, which probably began as 401K accounts while still working. The accounts were funded with earnings PRE-TAX (the money was removed from your paycheck BEFORE taxes were deducted). When you retire, these funds are used as a source of income for your expenses. Since they were not taxed when deposited into the 401K/IRA, these funds are FULLY TAXABLE as ordinary income when they are withdrawn in your retirement. Withdrawals can be made without penalty any time after age 59½. At age 72 (73 if you turn 72 after December 31, 2022), you are REQUIRED to withdraw a "Required Minimum Distribution" or RMD each year in an amount based on your age and the balance in your IRA. You will be required to pay tax on this withdrawal as if it were ordinary earned income.

In 2006, a provision of the Pension Protection Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-280) established the "Qualified Charitable Distribution" or QCD. Eligibility for making QCDs from a taxable IRA begins at age 70½. A QCD is a VOLUNTARY withdrawal from your IRA, up to \$100000 in 2023 (\$105000 in 2024), which is paid DIRECTLY to a qualified charity or tax-exempt organization (like St. Katherine). The donor pays NO TAX on the withdrawal and, as a tax-exempt entity, the charity or church pays no tax either. When you file your tax return, you can normally deduct the full amount of the QCD if you itemize deductions. This is a "win-win" in that you can donate to the church or other qualified entity, pay no tax, and have the recipient benefit in the full amount of your QCD. Any amount donated as a QCD in a given year is deducted from the required RMD amount for that year, up to and including your entire RMD amount (subject to the \$100000 (\$105000 in 2024) limit).

This option requires some advance planning so individuals considering it should consult a tax professional and/or financial advisor to ensure that all the above conforms to your personal situation and circumstances before making any withdrawals or donations.

Advance Charitable Deduction is another option where you might consider pre-paying part or all of your 2024 giving, thus advancing the deduction into 2023. [This can be especially helpful to individuals who marginally itemize their deductions, possibly allowing them to itemize for 2023 and then take the standard deduction for 2024.]
